MIND THE GAP April 4 - June 3, 2012 Main Salon, Chapel Gallery

Mind the Gap, a Dunlop Art Gallery touring exhibition, celebrates with resounding exuberance, the wealth of talent amongst the diverse population of emerging artists in the province of Saskatchewan. The title refers to the often misguided term that Saskatchewan has recently come to be saddled with - the gap in the Canada's geo-cultural landscape. The exhibition's title also quotes the famous automated safety warning on the London tube, Mind the Gap! We do mind actually. And the world should mind Saskatchewan. This exhibition includes visual arts from 30 artists from 14 cities and towns across Saskatchewan.

Mind the Gap is funded by Saskatchewan Arts Board, Canada Council for the Arts, Regina Public Library, Saskatchewan Publishers Group and the Culture on the Go Pilot Program. Culture on the Go is made possible through funding provided to Saskatchewan Arts Board by the Government of Saskatchewan through the Ministry of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport.

Dimensions 2011 present 33 works of which one third are from emerging Saskatchewan artists. Works of art for the Dimensions 2011 exhibition were selected by Paul Lapointe of Batoche, SK and Jane Kenyon of Vancouver, BC. It was their responsibility to review 156 craft objects and present for tour the best Saskatchewan has to offer. Lapointe is a master artisan who has worked in wood, printmaking, and mixed media. Kenyon is a textile artist who grew up in Saskatoon where she studied and practiced medicine.

Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies provides applied skills training for careers in a variety of areas . As a student in the visual arts strand students experience the visual arts as both artist and audience. As artists, they can use the processes and materials of visual art to explore their own ideas, experiences, feelings, cultural identities, observations and imaginations. As audience, they can see

how other artists have expressed their ideas about the world and their place in it. In contemporary art (including painting, print-making, architecture, sculpture, craft, commercial art, film, video, gallery installations, etc.) students see artists' reflections on the world in the students' own lifetimes.

These exhibition pieces represent the culmination of student's work over a 3 and a half month period in completion of requirements for Art 30 accreditation. Various techniques, methods. and medium were explored throughout the course. Using selected Saskatchewan artists and others' work as a focus of student study; students were asked to

simply create "something" meaningful or personal on a theme of significance to themselves, their community, or their culture as reflected through the use of re-versioned recycled materials. Additional selections represent student's interpretation of "Dreams" limited to the use of stains, dyes, and paint on a wood medium and several group projects involving paper mache with student determined themes.

DESKART: Karlie King June I - 30, 2012 Window Salon, Chapel Gallery

This body of artwork utilizes old wooden desk tops to visually explore and represent the ideas of French Philosopher Descartes. The desk tops used in DeskArt (pronounced day-Kart) were collected from Mervin School previous to its demolition in 2010. The desks came from various schools within the local school system, but they ended up in

Mervin School since the school board closed it in the 1980s and deemed it a repository for non-salvageable items. The desktops are a pastiche of various types of artworks. To begin, the impetus of each piece is the original carving on the desk, accomplished by numerous students throughout the years. From these carvings the overall purpose of the piece is then further explored with image transfers and print-making techniques. For instance, a desktop that has a cube carved into it then has further layers of geometrical shapes printed on it as a means of exploring Descartes theory of analytical geometry. Another case in point uses the classic carving of one's name as a means of representing Descartes' well-known idiom, "I think, therefore I am." Yet one more example is the desktop that features image transfers of 'orb photography' (i.e., photos that feature spirits) as a way of examining Descartes theology.

FEATURE GIFTSHOP ARTIST: KARLIE KING

The Allen Sapp Gallery Giftshop is currently featuring the work of Mervin artist Karlie King. Come in and check out some of her ceramic work or visit her at Flux Fine Art Studio in Mervin, Sk.

Karlie King was born and raised in Saskatchewan. But she has spent much time in other parts of

Canada and has travelled overseas. In 2009, Karlie returned to Saskatchewan, shortly after the birth of her first child. She and her husband, Jay Kimball, moved into an old homestead house in Mervin, where they enjoy being new parents, gardening, renovating and creating art. Karlie was also part in the Art Mentorship Program run by Chapel Gallery in North Battleford.

"My art is determined and inspired by where I'm at in life - the present moment. For instance, my current artistic endeavours reflect a completely new way of working artistically. As a new mother, I no longer have the luxury of solitary art-time or a controlled environment."

Technically, in terms of ceramics, I mostly do slab work. I predominantly create tiles and most of my sculptural work and functional tableware is hand built with slabs. In terms of construction, there's a bit of a cross-over between my clay work and textile practice, because I often treat clay like fabric and use sewing principles to construct. In regards to surface,



I typically try and let the clay speak for itself in terms of texture and colour. For instance, I'll create a sculpture using different clay bodies for colour variance rather than rely on glazes for this purpose. However, when I do use glaze it is very simple. I'll use the same surface treatment for an entire body or work. Similarly, the basis of much of my textile work is playing with colour and texture. The pattern may be simple but the colours and textures are what bring the textile to life. For more information contact Karlie at monel13@gmail.com.
